London Enterprise Academy Rated

London Enterprise Academy is proud to announce its recent Ofsted inspection, which has rated the school as Good in all four key areas: Quality of Education, Behaviour and Attitudes, Personal Development, and Leadership and Management. This marks a significant improvement from the previous inspection in 2022 which rated the school as Requires Improvement overall.

The latest report, following an inspection in October 2024, highlights the school's exceptional progress and effective leadership. Among the key findings, inspectors praised:

• Rich and Ambitious Curriculum:

"The school has designed a rich curriculum for all pupils which is based on the scope and ambition of the national curriculum."

High Behavioural Standards:

"The school's high expectations for behaviour are well understood by pupils. There is a fair and clear behaviour system. Any behaviour incidents are closely followed up by leaders."

• Effective SEND Support:

"The school's support for pupils with SEND is effective. Teachers make appropriate adaptations so that pupils are able to fully access the learning."

 Personal Development and Enrichment Opportunities:

"Personal development is a thread that runs throughout the whole curriculum... Pupils take advantage of [enrichment opportunities] and talk about how much they value them."

Robust Safeguarding Arrangements:

"Assemblies address any issues or important messages that may be required to help to keep pupils safe."

The school, which opened as a Free School in 2014, celebrated its 10th anniversary in October 2024. This year has been particularly rewarding, with students achieving excellent GCSE results, surpassing the national average in English, Maths and Science.

Principal Ashid Ali expressed his pride:

"We welcomed the opportunity to show the inspectors the significant progress made since their last visit. They found that students are happy and benefitting from our ambitious curriculum and extensive extra-curricular programme. The recognition of our high standards of behaviour and focus on reading is a testament to our dedicated team and hardworking students."

Nazim Ahmed, Chair of Governors, added:

"I am incredibly proud that we have achieved the Ofsted rating the school deserves. Our staff have worked tirelessly to ensure our students receive the best opportunities. As a small school with huge ambitions, we look forward to building on this success and aiming for Outstanding at our next inspection."

The school is also looking ahead to two exciting international trips to Spain in December and Bangladesh in February, reflecting its commitment to providing enriching experiences beyond the classroom.

Year 11 Students Inspired at Our Careers Fair

On 27th November our school proudly hosted a dynamic Careers Fair bringing together over 35 industry professionals, civil service representatives, educational institutions, colleges, sixth forms, universities and vocational training providers. This event offered a wealth of opportunities for our year 11 students to explore their future career and educational pathways.



Year 10 Mock Trial

All Rise!

A group of our Y10 students represented the school in the London Regional Bar Mock Trial heat.

This involved the students putting into practice their advocacy skills in a real Crown Court courtroom.

The students spent a great deal of time and effort preparing their cases - involving reflecting on the relevant case law, practising delivery, reviewing evidence, and coming up with questions for cross examination.

In R v Hinton - a (mock) case involving an alleged assault occasioning actual bodily harm, lead prosecutors Nikol and Moosa presented a strong case against the defendant, Mr Hinton, who squirmed under Nikol's forensic and forceful cross examination.

In the second case, R v Speed, a case involving an apparent use of a doping drug in an athletic competition, lead prosecutors Sanjida and Nikol, once again presented a strong case for the Crown. After a strong performance from Nikol - during which she did not refer to her notes once - the jury returned a verdict of guilty.

In the final case, a repeat of R v Hinton (this time with LEA defending Mr Hinton), defence barristers Labiba and Shiba diligently exposed inaccuracies and holes both in the evidence and the statements from witnesses.



The fair was a resounding success, providing students with invaluable insights into the diverse academic and vocational options available. From university courses to apprenticeship programs and industry career advice, attendees gained knowledge and inspiration to help shape their post-16 decisions.

We extend a heartfelt thank you to all the providers who joined us and shared their expertise. Your support has played a crucial role in empowering our students to make informed and confident choices for their futures.
